

The only reason that I do not rate this at 5 stars, is I would like to see more words....and does not allow half stars. The number one reason I really like this book is because along with the picture, English word and Arabic word, there is phonetic (English) pronunciation of the word. So if you do not read Arabic, you can still learn what the Arabic word is. Just as a note, this is neither a small book nor a large one. It is very thin, but it is an awkward shape. about 8x9. Some people prefer specific dimensions, and this one is not a normal sized book. I highly recommend this book (and the other "My First Book of Words") for children and beginners of the language alike.

Be care full parents.. This is Egyptian Arabic NOT standard Arabic.... If you are any other Arab then Egyptian, this toy will ruin your child's pronunciation! It is like if you were American and you teach your child Indian or Australian accent and dialect with this toy!

The book assigned each word with a picture and the object name is provided in both English and Arabic. Plus the translator is listed as translator.com, I am not sure what does that means. It is ok for people trying I learn basic Arabic in general.

As a travel writer of travel guides for kids, I'm always looking for books that can help bring a culture or country to life for children. Being able to speak a few words in the native tongue is an important way to feel closer to the culture you came so far to see. Words like, "yes, no, thank you, please" are a good way to start. The photos are large and colorful and easily labled in Arabic, English with phonetics to know how to pronounce a word. A must read for kids before heading to an Arabic speaking country!

This is not classical arabic it's more close to egyptian arabic, I recommend to change the Arabic word to classical ones.
